Dear Marilyn,

Child Care Resources would like to express our deepest thanks to you and the Tulalip Tribes Charitable Contributions for your generous gift. Your sponsorship of the 2021 Seeds of Change Annual Event had a great impact! We were able to use your dollars to cover the costs of the event so the \$140,000+ funds raised at the event supported families experiencing homelessness – with an emphasis on families of color and those farthest from opportunity – in our region. Almost 200 children were supported with high quality, consistent, supportive child care as a result of the funds we raised for these families.

As we close our fiscal year, CCR did some great things this year with the funds you helped raise that I want to share:

- We were able to expand our focus on well-being and mental health support for our youngest children. This is especially impactful for children experiencing homelessness who, coupled with the impacts of COVID, are experiencing great trauma which shows up daily in their behaviors. We support the adults in their lives so that they can effectively support these children. This means no suspension or expulsion from child care and supportive, trauma-informed care.
- We won a federal award to launch Early Head Start, specific to infants and toddlers, and did so with a laser focus on children of color in South King County and Pierce County.
- Our Kaleidoscope Play and Learn groups exploded over the last year as families caring for their children during a pandemic yearned for connection and information on supporting child development. We serve roughly 6,000 children!
- Our advocacy influenced the passage of our state's biggest investment in early learning, which will provide access for more families and expand needed supports.



Throughout the last year, CCR has continued to refine its services to meet the changing needs of our families and providers. More emphasis on safety, mental health and access so that all children could find supportive early learning environments during an incredibly difficult time. Overall, CCR supported over 24,000 individuals and families across the state in FY 2021-2022 through our statewide call center and services.

We have a lot of amazing work happening and would love to share more. We also have our 2022 Seeds of Change Annual Event coming up on October 14, 2022 which I hope Tulalip Tribes will sponsor once more. We greatly appreciate your investment, and I would love to talk to you about your funding priorities and if we can continue to partner.
