Dear Tulalip Tribes Charitable Contributions,

Thank you for your support of REACH's Housing program. Your support of [REDACTED] impacted 25 households. The REACH program links individuals living outdoors with resources, support, and case management to prevent homelessness. Many clients have disabilities, mental health conditions, and/or substance use disorders. With your gift, we helped our clients with housing related needs that includes rental assistance, deposits, renter's insurance, and food, among other needs. These needs make such a huge difference in the lives of our clients.



Housing our clientele (those who are homeless and struggling with substance use disorders) is the fastest way to improve their lives. Patients who are stably housed are less likely to overdose, are more likely to access treatment for other health issues, and are more likely to regularly attend counseling sessions, meet with their case worker, and take medications for opioid use disorders.

Housing remains a crucial need in our community. The King County Regional Homeless Authority tracks the number of homeless individuals who utilize housing, medical, and/or behavioral health services. Last year, they counted more than 40,000 residents experiencing homelessness. The high cost of housing, less than 1% of housing in the county is affordable for people earning 30% or less of the median income. People of color represent 27% of King County's population, but 57% of the homeless population according to the Committee to End Homelessness in King County.
