During fiscal year 2024 (July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024), we are proud to report the impact of our work in Snohomish County.

Through our **Core Work**, we locate imperfect yet healthy produce, coordinate harvesting and packaging, identify a hunger relief organization that needs it and arrange donated or discounted transportation to deliver it. In FY24, we moved 517,838 pounds of food to Farmer Frog, which is located in Snohomish and distributes food to hunger relief organizations throughout Puget Sound. Most of the loads delivered were potatoes from Wallace Farm and Knutzen Farm, located in Skagit County.

Our **Farm to Community (F2C)** initiative includes two programs that operate in Snohomish County: Farm to Food Pantry and Growing for Good, a partnership with PCC Community Markets and Neighborhood Farmers Markets. They provide technical support, ongoing management, and funding to hunger relief organizations to purchase produce directly from local small to mid-scale growers at wholesale prices. In Snohomish County, we partnered with Arlington Food Bank, Darrington Food Bank, Farmer Frog, and Maltby Food Bank. In FY24, they purchased a total of 21,457 pounds of fresh produce and healthy food from the following 20 farms:

In addition to the 21,457 pounds of food purchased, the farms donated 4,266 pounds of produce to the four food banks in Snohomish County.

Our **Capacity Building** program awards small grants (under \$5,000) to under resourced hunger relief organizations to help them invest in improving cold storage and food handling capacity. In FY24, we awarded three grants to hunger relief organizations in Snohomish County:

- With the increased need for food in Sky Valley Food Bank’s community, they sourced more food than ever before and despite adding warehouse racks last year, they ran out of space. We awarded them a grant to purchase a dry box unit to allow them to safely store 8-10 additional pallets of food.
- We awarded a grant to Marysville Community Food Bank to purchase an electric pallet jack, which is essential to the storage and retrieval of donated food.
- Granite Falls Community Coalition was unable to take delivery of a forklift due to lack of secure onsite storage. We awarded them a grant to purchase a secure wire security cage to store their forklift onsite.
