Dear Marilyn and Friends at the Tulalip Cares Fund,

Thank you for making a gift last year to support Kandelia's programs for immigrant and refugee students and their families. Across all our programs Kandelia served over 600 individuals last program year. Here are some highlights of the work that was supported by Tulalip's grant:

- During the last school year our after-school programs served 131 students from 24 countries, with at least 22 different languages spoken.
- 89 students participated in Kandelia's summer school program, with 73 students attending at least 80% of classes and earning \$500 stipends and credit towards high school graduation. Many of our students support themselves financially or help provide financial support to family members in their home countries, so offering stipends makes it easier for students to prioritize their learning. During summer school students practiced English, gained school credit towards graduation, and had field trips to get to know the Seattle area.
- So far this school year 134 students have enrolled in Kandelia programs, and we've begun expanding our eligibility to immigrant, refugee, and English Language Learner students in additional high schools. Our youth programs continue to focus on supporting students with English language learning, building healthy relationships and a sense of community with peers and adults, and exploring interests and gaining skills so they can complete high school ready for college and careers.
- Kandelia provided over 1,300 hours of classes and workshops in our Family Programs, including English, digital literacy, and other classes to support self-sufficiency.
- Kandelia's Food Access program provided over \$80,000 of food in weekly food bags, reaching 611 individuals. This year with additional grant funding we're supplementing food donated through food banks with culturally relevant herbs and spices and more meats and protein.
