2024-1 class report

Program Length

Hours 513

Monday-Friday, 8:00 am- 3:00 pm

The class built the module is a building that consists of two mini rooms where the students learned to build floors, walls, install windows and doors. They laid out stairs and built an entry way. They learned to install drywall and repair damaged drywall. They wired the rooms for electricity and installed outlet boxes, light switches and lights fixtures. They learned to install a bathroom vanity and toilet as well as connecting it to plumbing pipes. NW electrical JATC partnered with TVTC to instruct building a three way circuit and OHM's Law.

This class the students learned to

- Read and understand basic blue prints, use an architect's scale, draw simple scaled orthographic drawings.
- Improved trades math skills with decimals, fractions, Pythagorean theorem and Ohm's law
- Learned components and safety of electrical.
- Identify, name, size and describe how basic construction materials and fasteners are used.
- Draw orthographic shop drawings and build a small wood personal project
- Recognize typical components of framing
- Lay out and frame basic wood floor platform
- Lay out and frame a typical wall, window and door openings
- Lay out a roof rafter and cut a typical stair jack
- Recognize fall safety issues and complete a fall protection plan
- Attend work place 101
- Complete an employment history record and create a resume
- Participate in a mock interview preparation
- Learn money management and budgeting
- Participate in Dependable strengths articulation

CLASS STATISTICS

Twenty-four applied to training, five declined attending. Nineteen started, three dropped within the first two weeks, one dropped the third month for lack of attendance leaving fifteen to complete the training.

TVTC partnered with Heritage high school to have seven students attend and earn their high school diploma upon graduation, one dropped for lack of attendance.

Two current students earned their high school diploma, two former students earned their high school diploma and one non-student, Tulalip tribe member completed the required paperwork to earn his high school diploma

To date fifty-six have earned their High School diploma through Renton Technical college 21 and up program and ten have earned their diploma through our partnership with Heritage high school bringing a total of sixty six diplomas earned.
